Subject: 2021 Pavement Maintenance Project

This letter is to inform you of construction starting for Ada County Highway District's 2021 Pavement Maintenance Project (phase 1). Construction is scheduled to start as early as June 2021 and substantial completion is scheduled for late fall 2021. The project consists primarily of the removal and replacement of either all or a portion of the existing asphalt pavement (depending on the street segment). Work also includes reconstructing adjacent curb ramps to meet current ADA standards and minor stormwater pipe replacements.

The road segments that are included in this project are listed below:

- Surprise Way from Amity Rd to HWY 21.
- Linden St from Broadway Ave to Gekeler Ln
- Boise Ave from Broadway Ave to Gekeler Ln
- Fairview Ave from Maple Grove Rd to Milwaukee St
- Curtis Rd from Fairview Ave to Ustick Rd
- Pleasant Valley Rd from Hollilynn Dr to Gowen Rd

During construction, temporary traffic control and flagging will be in place. For the majority of the work travel lanes will be open, however short-term closures may be required. The work may also include general construction noise, dust, equipment back-up alarms, ground vibration, traffic delays and parking restrictions.

Regular construction hours for Boise Ave, Linden St, Curtis Rd, and Surprise Way are 8:30am to 4:30pm Monday through Friday, with an optional evening shift allowed from 6:00pm to 10:00pm. Work on these segments is also allowed on weekends from 7:00am to 10:00pm.

Construction on Fairview Avenue will be at night, 8:00pm to 6:00am during weekdays. Weekend work is allowed during the day and/or night.

Construction on Pleasant Valley Road is allowed day or night, including weekends.

Access to homes and businesses along the project will be maintained for the majority of construction, unless previous or future agreements are made. For some driveways, there may be a need for a short duration closure which is typically limited to about 30 minutes while the asphalt paving is occurring directly in front of the driveway. This will allow for the new asphalt to be placed and to cool to a safe temperature. Emergency access however will be accommodated if the need arises during these times.

ACHD has a no cut policy for new pavement for a period of five years in order to maintain the integrity of the newly constructed road. If you have plans to develop property adjacent to this project, or desire to connect a utility (gas, water, etc.) not presently servicing your parcel, the utility stub-outs or connections should be made at this time. Please contact the respective utility for information pertaining to the desired service. Please also let us know if you are arranging this with a utility company so that we can coordinate with them as needed.

If you own property along the project corridor, but do not live there, please pass this information on to your renter or tenant.

We regret any inconvenience that this work may cause you, however the project will provide an improved pavement condition and extend the life of the roadway.
